

## 2011 COBURG 6 HOUR CHAMPIONSHIPS

# 10 March 2013 Coburg Athletics Track, Coburg, Melbourne



The 2013 Coburg 24 Hour Carnival is spread over 2 weekends, with the 6 Hour events held on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> March and the 24 Hour events to be held on the weekend of 13<sup>th</sup> - 14<sup>th</sup> April. With Melbourne under the influence of ongoing sweltering conditions, the decision was made to bring the start time for the 6 Hour Championships forward from 8AM to 6AM. The decision was well received by competitors and it proved a correct one as the temperature was around 35 °C by the time the event finished at midday on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> March.

#### 6 Hour Run Men

The 6AM start ensured that the first few hours of the events were run in ideal conditions and 2011 winner David Staehr took full advantage, completing 14km in the first hour and opening a break to Kevin Muller, Justin Scholz, David Alcock and Luke Stratford. By the 3 hour mark, he had covered 42.8km and was some 6 laps in front of Kevin with David a further 6 laps back. He continued this same pace for a further hour, extending his lead to 9 laps and reaching 56.4km by the 4 hour mark. But then it was a case of survival as the sun came out and the temperature quickly soared. His lead had been reduced to 3 laps by the 5 hour mark as Kevin made big inroads into what had looked an insurmountable lead and, with some 30 minutes to go, David surrendered his lead to Kevin.

Kevin's winning time of 75.909km was a 1km PB and improved on his third place here in 2012. David rallied with the end in sight and ran on to take second with 74.950km while Justin Scholz took third with 70.667km after running a very consistent race throughout. With the first 10 finishers all over 62km, it was a high standard event, especially considering the tough conditions during the last 2 hours of the event.

#### 6 Hour Run Women

Sharon Scholz and Amie Siemonek took the women's field out with a steady 11.2km in the first hour. But from then on, it was all Sharon as her pace hardly varied from hour to hour. Her final distance of 65.786km was well above the 63km required to prove her fitness ahead of this year's World 24 Hour Championships and a good hitout ahead of the May Worlds. Stephanie Burrell ran a 6km PB to finish second with 62.495km while first timer Wendy Cook ran excellently for third with 55.266km.

## 6 Hour Walk Women

Michelle Thompson was in a class of her own in the walk divisions, covering 9.3km in the first hour and holding that same pace throughout the entire race to break her own **Australian Women's 6 Hour Walk Record** with 55.865km (she held it previously with 64.636km, set here at Coburg in 2012). Karyn O'Neill took second with 45.735km while Dawn Parris was third with 43.476km. It was a dominant display by Australia's best female ultra walker and this performance adds to her growing collection of records. An inspection of her lapsheets indicate she passed the 50km mark in **5:22:00**, an **Australian Women's 50km track best**.
